My dear Sir,

Since I had the pleasure of meeting you several overtures have been made respecting the T. Property but always from some unforeseen cause we have been prevented from making any satisfactory disposition of it as yet. But now circumstances require us to make more than ordinary exertions to place the property in some more satisfactory position than at present and with this view we intend at once offering the St. Marys Mine alone embracing lot 19 in 5th Con and three contiguous lots (800^{ac}) in England but upon looking over your separate report of that lot I find it makes no general reference to the property. This probably arises from the fact that I divided the first general report into three

separate reports one of each Mine.

If I remember right you stated to me that before printing the Report you would like to revise it. Now we intend getting your Report of the St. Mary Mine printed at once so I thought it well to write you and ask you to look over your draft of the Original report and give us a new separate report of St. Mary Mine alone (having no reference to our other Mines) as full and general as you can possibly make it adding if you see fit any new facts which may have come within your knowledge on the subject. If you will do this with all possible despatch I shall be very greatly obliged.
