good specimens of Comifera from the
trap ash of Arran, which may

interest you. Our Session is over
for a season, and that of the Royal
Society in this City closes on Sunday
next. I observed from the
Royal Society Proceedings that you
delivered the Bakerian Lecture
before that Body in May last.

The Specimens of which you speak
in your letter will I doubt not be
most acceptable to our Collection.
