stem of Calamodendron of which I left a

of which a specimen collected by me was
laid out from your collection and (3) a
fragment of Calamite showing a curious
articulation. If these cannot be engraved
will you kindly send the specimens to
me with the others I left and I
shall have them done with some paper
I am to get up for the Survey report
here. I shall carefully return the
specimen (the strobilus) which belongs
to the Society. If sent to Messrs Sampson
