

Pine Island

May 3<sup>rd</sup> 1871

My dear Professor Dawson,

By reason of my  
absence from the Island your  
note of the 10<sup>th</sup> April did not  
reach me until the 28<sup>th</sup>.

I immediately upon  
its receipt submitted it to my  
Brother, who, on behalf of the  
Institution most willingly  
acquiesced to the conditions named  
by you. I am authorized

by my Brother to state to you  
that the sum of \$500 (five  
hundred dollars) will be at  
your place at your disposal  
and that you will be at  
liberty to report as you  
may think proper - and  
further that the Government  
of this Island will most  
gladly authorize the publication,  
under your direction, and  
at the expense of the Colony  
of your report and of such  
illustrative sections



and papers as may be attached  
to it, believing that such  
information from your  
pen could not fail to  
promote the interests of the  
Island. The months of July  
and August will be  
mutually convenient.

to hear from you, and if I  
cause of any business to you  
may command my services
