My dear Dr Dawson:—

I beg to thank you for two copies of your extremely interesting & valuable work on the Old Palaeozoic Plants. I have presented one of them to the University Library in your name

I have just returned from a very successful journey on the Eastern Amazonas & the Tapajós, bringing with me a fine lot of Devonian and Carboniferous marine fossils. One of the most interesting results of my journey is the determination of the position of the same series of Carboniferous rocks on both sides of the Amazonian valley showing that the basin is undoubted by these rocks.

I have restudied the Ereci district and have visited the Table

topped hills confirming & extending my conclusions of last year.

I have a fragment of fossil wood from the Sandstone of Evreé, another from the Tertiary(?) clays of the Amazonas; a quantity of leaves in clays & iron-stone probably recent; a Sporophyton, a Lepidodendron and spore cases of ditto, from Carboniferous of Tapirjo, and a beautiful tree fern from the Upper Tocantins. I should like to submit these to you for examination, if you feel like studying them.

Would you have the kindness to inform me whether a copy of my book was sent you by my publishers. I sent them a list in which was your name, but I have just learned to my great regret that my order was not faithfully attended to.
