My Dear Sir

I have received your favour of the 29th ult. - I shall be happy to lend you the specimens referred to.

I am always ready to contribute anything that may aid in the promotion of Geological Science - I have no will to monopolize or to be an Antagonist with any one. All I want is fairness and a due regard to right and justice - I am sorry that I am called upon to maintain a position apparently Antagonistic to the Geological Survey.

I commenced with a determination to give every aid in the prosecution of the Survey but the treatment which I received from Dr. W. Logan when in Montreal the exact counterpart of what I received from yourself and a terrible loss and family placed me in the position which I now occupy. His subsequent treatment in the matter of the shipping, however, which arose from the interference of Prof. Morris and the University, which I made no more the matter worse and even made me suspect that the same

I was disposed to make every allowance
for the letter as the friendship of two
antagonists is not easily maintained
and of course my friendship is a still

Loper. - Mr. Loper and Henry Hunt.

I was glad, after what I had feared
to meet you and your son. It has re-
minded me of the asperities which I
have referred to.

After all my antagonism to the
Society may promote the interests of
Religion as Controversies may thereby arise
which may prevent the dissemination
of errors which otherwise to all intents
may permit to pass current. - I am
not therefore very anxious to change my
position in relation to the Society.

I knew that Sr. W. Loper is trying
to persuade that my antagonism is
of no consequence and that my denunciations
are crude and unwholesome - Several
in spite of this the persons whom
I occupy in connection with the Provi-
dential Magazine and as a Teacher of Religion
as well as my connection with Scien-
tific Societies may to some extent coun-
teract such insinuations.

You speak of the Henchate River. I am
the Certainty Mota - I had supposed
that it was Carpenter's. I had not
examined its course very particularly
as I expected to give some more atten-
tion to it when I should resume my
examination of the Henchate.

The channel seems now to be the
same as the top of the Amisig Plate
between the Pei and Maligout Creeks
and also of the top of the Amisig
Mount Super Loof and the Amisig
to the South of it - whether or not it
be in fact it has been placed in
an apparently-entirely-incorrect place
ever it occurs - The collection of Col.
Rice Mc Crean of Albany and Jefferson
and those of Chisig and Amisig
in the Mountain New England -

I suppose that you mean by the Lower
Henchate Loof of Amisig Plate of
Maligout. I examined it very par-
ticularly at Maligout - I could not
find it beyond John Mc Donald's
Farm. I thought I had found its
continuation on the north side of
the wood at the Farm - but the

Apparent Contractions seemed to be
