My dear Sir,

With reference to my letter of Saturday another point occurs, which I should have mentioned. We have only one right of search on the lots 104. 105 &c. west of the Specular, this practically limits our explorations to this fall.

Had I thought of this when in Pictou as I should probably have gone on the ground myself. But now I think it absolutely necessary that Fraser should go on it, especially above Water ville, and I shall ask George to examine any discoveries he may make, that we may get our Mining Areas selected before winter. If Fraser can find the hard quartz-ge bed with strings of ore, which lies North of the specular on Mc Donald's, this will be a good guide, & see slip enclosed. George also writes to me that an apparent bed of ore has been found in rear of Frasers (Saddler) which he thinks may be a ^{representative} ~~representative~~ of

the Blanchard one, If this be so, I think it quite likely that it will extend into our now useless area N^o 49. (Please give George if he has it not already a plan showing this lot 49)

In writing of the Wentworth area on N^o 101, I had in view the fact that we cannot safely make a bargain till the suit is decided (if a suit is undertaken) but we might have an understanding as to what could be done.

George regrets that an opening cannot be made at Frasers land at Wentworth, could not some one represent to him (Fraser) that by preventing this he is in any case hurting himself; and perhaps by a liberal offer for land damages, he might see it his interest not to make any trouble at all.

Please communicate this to George as I have not time this evening to write another letter.
