

Copy of Memo to Mr Prentice with reference to areas on Schedule of plan.

(1) Fraser should be allowed as soon as possible to go on areas 103 to 107 with the view of making discoveries & testing the areas I have provisionally marked on the plan.

(you should get tracing of Holmes' plan showing reserved & unreserved farms)

(2) Consult Mr J. M. Dawson & Mr Simon Holmes as to the ~~probable~~<sup>possible</sup> selection of another mining area on reserved land on right of Search no 46, & also as to the best place on 48 after Hudsons Selection. This with reference to the Limonite, & also with reference of new discoveries of bedded ore referred to by Mr J. M. D.

(3) Consult Mr J. M. Dawson as to the suitability of the mining areas provisionally marked on Nos 101 ~~101~~ 45, 102, 108; & if he agrees it may be well to secure them, or such of them, as seem good at once.

(4) Consult Mr Drumrose about a third right of Search on areas 103 to 107, & ascertain from him the limits of the Wentworth grant on 101. I have suggested to Mr P. the propriety of arranging with Mr J. Fraser, one of the Wentworth proprietors, on the basis of payment of land damages, so as to get opportunity immediately to explore on his ground.

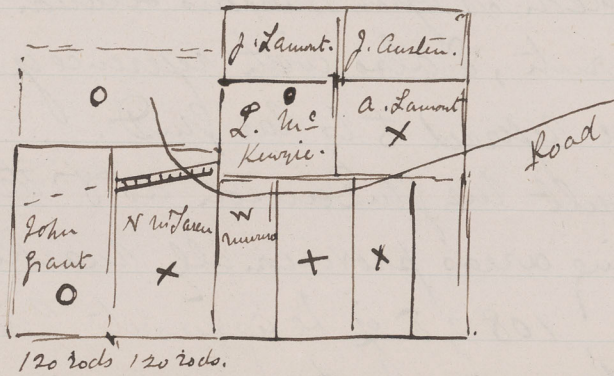
(5) I have asked Mr J. M. Dawson to collect any facts he can as to cost of extraction & conveyance of ore, limestone &c. Mr Dan can give all information as to cost of railway.

(6) Mr J. M. D. should return to Montreal so soon as his field work is finished & prepare a full report on the deposits as now exposed. to be sent to you at as early a date as possible.
