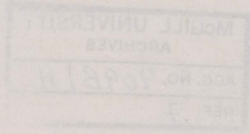
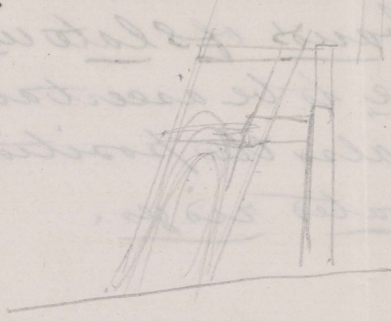

The only place where I saw ore on the lots referred to was on Dr Williamsons Farm near Fairg, I suppose near the western limit of our last lot 50104. The vein at this place did not show more than 18 inches, and thus mixed with stone and ankerite or "spar" but I saw a large loose fragment which must have been from a richer place. I also heard afterwards that specular ore had been seen in a brook at one McKees between the above place and Gleugary station. Gleugary station itself is about the junction of the Carboniferous and the old slates, and if the ore occurs there it should be south of the station. I have more hope however of the ground west of McColls area or lots 105 + 103 and would like at least the course of the bands of slate usually holding the ore to be ascertained on these lots also the position of the most elevated ridges.
