

London 13 Sep 1873

My dear Sir

I wrote you last week to
 push on with the mining work
 on the Fraser-Sadler Area, as
 required by the Government. This
 is the main object of the work, but
 another object may be obtained.
 It is said on all hands that this
 the most important area is not
 sufficiently proved, & I cannot
 gainsay it. I would therefore
 suggest that every effort be made
 before the weather gets too bad,
 to prove this deposit in depth
 as well as length & breadth.
 You will know best what is to
 be done. I think that a pit
 of the depth of not less than
 100 feet should be sunk on
the vein.

 He will contract with
 one who has broken on the
 lines of Railway
 & me
