Dear Sir

We duly rec<sup>d</sup> your of 27. Ult.  
and have paid \$25. at the Mines Office which secured  
the Extension of the License to work the Limonite  
Area at Fraser Saddlers for another year from 10<sup>th</sup>  
April 1874. but the Commissioner of Mines has  
notified us that it will be necessary to forward to  
his office the License to work at any time before 10<sup>th</sup>  
April next in order that the renewal may be en-  
dorsed thereon. We presume you have the License  
with you but in any event have it sent to us so  
that we may be able to get the Endorsation made  
within the time specified.

We this morning mail to your  
address in one parcel per "Book Post" two copies of the Com-  
plete Mining Acts of this Province as revised and passed  
at the last session of the Legislature. You will observe  
the Royalty on Iron is three cents per ton of 2000 lbs on  
the ore and not on the manufactured iron as has been  
reported.

Mr Dawson has written us of your  
Enquiry about another License to work on Area 48.  
48. We think the Fraser Saddler 5/8 square mile and

Hudsons square mile covers nearly all of that area  
on which the crown reserved the iron in the grants  
We will make particular Enquiry on this subject and  
report to you again.
