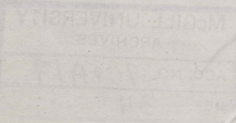

Dear Sir Patron Mining Right

at 2 o'clock pm yesterday I
 sent you a cable message in the
 name of Mr. Prentiss "are selections
