Pres. Dawson

Dear Sir, I have your kind
favour of the 20th inst. and we
are much gratified by the prospect
of having you with us. The subjects
you propose are those on which we
would of all others desire to hear
you. I take for granted that Mr.
Adams can interpose no objection:
as the usefulness of the lectures can-
not but be increased by their deliv-
ery before the young men assembled
here and even in a Commercial
point of view it will be advantageous
as it will tend to increase the demand

for the volume when they are published.
And such interchange is not unusual.
Lectures have been delivered here and
at other seminaries which were prepared
for Andover. And this next year
Dr. John Hall is to deliver a course
at Union Seminary, New York, which
had been previously announced
for New Haven.

I think I mentioned before that
we will accommodate ourselves
entirely to your convenience in
respect to times - though in my
judgment the evening is greatly
to be preferred. Students of both in-
stitutions will then be able to
without interfering with any other

regular class exercises. The next
most eligible time would be
at noon.

I should add that the Seminary
