on our Circular would give it great force in Canada.
I am however well aware of this but I expect
you will see a notice of the "Effort" in the "Witness"
shortly and should you feel inclined to endorse
the movement by a donation it will have a
very helpful effect in forwarding our cause at
home and abroad. We do not ask the general
public by circular for this object. Our appeal is
to residents in this County and the sons of Pictou
abroad.

I know you have many "calls" upon
you but I hope you will be able to think
kindly of this "help us" with it.
