My dear Prof Jones,

I return by this
mail your Bibliography
of fiction, in case you
should have a chance
to publish it in England,
I retain a copy for a
similar purpose here.
I have modified the earlier
part a little, and have
added Credner's, Burrows's
and Waker's papers. The
latter is a new sceptic,
who has risen up in

Germany, and who seems
for shame scarcely yet glamed
at what he says, the
Cabnet under the same
defect of sufficient material
and of knowledge of the
elementaries of preservation
of fossils, with some of
the other objections. Dallas
writes to me that he is
going to translate Wahn's
papers for the Annals.
I hope he will give Carpenter
& you some chance to
annotate it a little.

I do not know that I acknowledge
cedged receipt of ^{the} Manitoba
specimens sent you & returned, they
arrived safe, and I thank
you for the note as to the
draws, which however I
find does not very
materially modify Gray's
published statements, I
send your notes to him
however, for we should
occasionally see. I am
very gratified to notice
- Dr Carpenter's reference to
Stromatopora in Siluria,
it would be a strong point
as authority; but it es-
caped my attention when

I was writing. I shall
not forget it next time
I write on any of these
papers.

I find you are right about
Lindström's name. How it got
turned into Lindberg. I do not
know. I cannot find him
even in reading his papers
that he makes Coenozo-
sterna anything but a coral.

I shall look with interest
in your notice of the Scam of
life and hope you will
add much light to it. Thanking
you for your kind notes &
suggestions, which I shall
hope to acknowledge in some
future opportunity, and with
all good wishes
