collection of all the  
Cinroids and crustaceans  
that can be obtained

either here or in the  
Lower Nelderberg rocks of  
Bertie and Willoughby  
Townships near the Niagara  
River. The crinoid bed here  
was last autumn covered  
by a bank of earth  
falling over it; this has  
now in great part been  
removed, and one or two  
more rainstorms will lay  
it bare. I have a  
box of fossils made up  
for the Museum, which



I shall send shortly; yet  
being unable to pay the  
Express charges myself, and  
unwilling to put you to the  
expense, I do not know  
how to address the box so that  
the college shall be charged  
with it, and neither you nor  
myself. In the box are a  
specimen of Subospina Granti,  
<sup>a specimen</sup> ~~and~~ of Caryocinus, some Pentamerus  
Pentamerus oblongus and some  
Stricklandia canadensis specimens,  
together with many more  
from the Niagara group,  
some Guelph fossils, and  
some Crickany corals.
