In the mean time Professor Penhallow who had been in conference with you called here and saw Professor Baker, and stated that you approved of the recommendation of the Faculty, and again changed it, I may say that I was surprised myself. But thought Professor Penhallow could not have misunderstood you, as I now find he had.

I have pleasure in informing you that at the meeting of the Faculty held on Saturday night, it was unanimously
