My dear Sir:

The Publication Committee of the Geol. Soc. Am., appointed at the last meeting of the Council at Washington were for some time in doubt as to the ability of the Society to pay for illustrating memoirs, and in some cases illustrated memoirs were held for a time for this reason. Moreover there was a great press of memoirs offered for publication and accepted by the Council for publication either with or without a condition growing out of the uncertainty as to the ability of the Society to bear the cost of publication. These causes have led to some delay in sending to press your valuable communication before the Society at Washington. Meantime I have put the illustrations in the hands of the engravers and have an estimate for cost of reproducing.

If your eight figures are grouped on two plates as indicated on the sheets of tracing paper enclosed herein (together with the copy) the reproduction can be made from the copy in its present condition for \$12 per plate, plus \$3 per plate for printing, an aggregate of \$46. Of this sum the Publication Committee direct me

If your eight figures are grouped on two plates as indicated on the sheets of tracing paper enclosed herein (together with the copy) the reproduction can be made from the copy in its present condition for \$12 per plate, plus \$3 per plate for printing, an aggregate of \$48. Of this sum the Publication Committee direct me

to say the Society will pay \$20.

Allow me to bring the matter to you for decision. Shall we reproduce from present copy, assessing to you \$26; do you prefer to make drawings susceptible of photoengraving on two plates which can be engraved and printed within the sum fixed by the Publication Committee; or would you rather authorize me to have drawings made by competent paleontologic draftsmen and submit ~~dit~~ either to you or to Professor Ward at small cost, at least a part of which will be paid out of the allotment for illustrating made by the Publication Committee ?

Allow me to say that in my judgment it would add value to your important communication, <sup>and</sup> be creditable to the publication of the Society to reproduce direct by the half-tone process at least your figures 2,5, and 7 cutting off so much of each photograph as is indicated by the tracings.
