My dear Mr Murray

The late Mr Killings,
about a year ago, placed in
my hands a few fossil plants
sent to him by you. I gave
him a list of them and re-
turned the specimens, except
three which I retained for
description, as finally new.
I now send you description of
a new Lepidodendron and notice
of a Camp which I suppose
to be my Dadoxylon matricum.
I have added a notice of
a curious plant = bearing Chert
from Cady's River collected
by Mr. Bell, and which
perhaps you know of.

No precise locality was
given me with the specimens
but the Lepidodendron
has a tubercle (10C) upon it

The carpenter and his men
tether, but I think the
specimen I have is merely
a chip off a large piece
which went back to
Mr B., and may have
had a tether.

If you care to
have a figure of the
Leptodendron, I can have
it drawn and get a
cut of it made. That
is if you care to pay
for it. If not, I shall
with your permission
return the specimens and
figure them when I
can get out a general

memoirs on the Corne-
formative plants, which
may be some time in
the future.

Has any one described
your Lower Carboniferous
shells. I know Bell
had some in his hands.
I have a number of
species collected by Bell,
some of them new,
which I may describe
some time, but I
do not want to do
so if any one is working
for you.

I have put under
Dr. Hargraves hands all

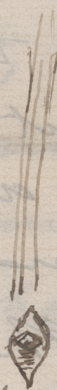
the material about
