Dear Sir: I have recently opened up a bed of Laramie fossil leaves on South Table mountain, near here, and should be very glad if some arrangements could be made by which I could put you up a good collection. The bed contains many rare and several new species, embracing oak, elm, walnut, willow, fig, buckthorn, Poplar, palm, wren-doxts, and many others. In all, over fifty species have been found in this bed. I can put you up a fine collection, covering pretty thoroughly the whole range of Laramie plants, for \$100⁰⁰, to be paid for after you have received and examined the specimens.
