

Saccammina liana.

I believe that this little form  
has again come under the notice  
of naturalists.\* When specimens <sup>from Sacramento</sup> were  
kindly sent to me some years ago  
by my friend & collector I was  
as a palaeobotanist naturally  
disposed to refer them to Characae,  
but a comparison with specimens  
from the Trent Limestone convinced  
me that they was entirely; and  
as I found that in form and texture  
they were in material <sup>the form</sup> cases  
referred to the well known Saccammina  
of the Carboniferous, I placed it pro-  
visionally in that genus, + subsequently  
and apparently without seeing what  
I had done, Ulrich ("Contributions",  
vol. II, 1856) described the Ohio Falls  
specimens, and referred them to  
Frammipora as I had done, but  
with the new name Moellerina  
Greeneri. I may say that I still  
hold to my original opinion that  
these organisms are Frammipora  
but, for the reasons fully stated
