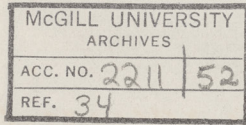

In the meantime with a view to the amalgamation we should like to have a statement of the affairs of your Coal Company.

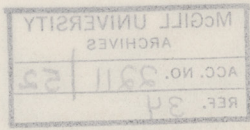
