Re Dawson's Baggage

I send you the telegrams in this matter. The facts are these. On Monday evening there was brought to the station over 100 pieces of Baggage for the Hon M<sup>r</sup> Ferrier, and others, to be checked to Cacouna, to go by Tuesday morning's train. While O'Hara was checking this Baggage, M<sup>r</sup> Dawson's man arrived with his Baggage for St Oetave. O'Hara checked it and also understood it was to go in morning also, but it seems M<sup>r</sup> Dawson went on Monday night's train, but said nothing about his Baggage; it went on Tuesday, when it passed River au Loup, Russell telegraphed him to meet the train and get it, but he did not do so. St Oetave being a flag station, and no one there to meet it, Conductor took it on, brought it back next train, no one there, he then left it at St ~~Charles~~ <sup>Plamie</sup>, and M<sup>r</sup> Dawson got it yesterday at St Oetave, M<sup>r</sup> Coleman their Genl P. & B. Agent told me there would be a man at St Oetave to attend to Baggage and to check to there, but I believe there is no station there yet.
