Dear Sir

I send you today an extra copy of my article on greenstones. You will see that I have said but little about the fossil remaining, simply advocating that <sup>the rocks</sup> they do contain such fossils, & using the argument in favor of my idea of the origin & formation of these rocks, which ideas though not peculiar to me, vary from the commonly received opinions regarding these particular rocks of New Hampshire. We have there an abundance of igneous rocks but I do not count these among them. I did not go into the discussion of those questions in which you are interested, & I sent specimens to you thinking that you would

perhaps use them. If you wish  
to do so I shall be glad, but  
if the specimens are of no particular  
value to you, I would like to have  
the one from Connecticut Lease  
which is the best I have of that  
kind, & I can not find any more  
as good. Of the other from Hearner  
I have others & do not care for it.

If you would like any

the figures of some of these remains  
I will gladly give them to you.
