Dear Sir

After I called
at your residence yesterday
I saw Mr. Ward who
his anxious to commence
operations, but I told
him to delay till I heard
from you. I do not know
if you have been to see
the line yet. I did not
measure it but it seems
to be about 30 inches at one
end & twenty at the other.
Mr. Rells as put in pickets
you will find them one
at the gate the other at the
foot of the fence and on
the crop fence — but as
Mr. Dawson said you
were extremely busy at
present I would suggest

that after you have
viewed the line that
you send me permission
to remove that portion
of the fence that may
be required for building
the other part you can
remove it at a later date
giving the parties who
move the fence instru-
-ctions to place the
posts on the centre of
the line —

I am really
sorry on your acct. that
the mistake should have
occurred more especially
as Mrs Dawson seems
particularly annoyed —
but it is better that
the error should have

been discovered now
than at a later date I
am further sorry that
the Street as been kept
in its present state so
long but you cant do
as you like with contri-
-actors ~~as~~ but I hope
it will soon draw
to a close please drop
me a line this afternoon
and Oblige
