My dear Dr Dawson

Prof. Oran's description
of his visit to Montreal reminded
me of a paper or rather 'note' I
have prepared on what I suppose
to be some Ceratoidae Column
& stems in Upper Laurentian
rocks, found by me in August
last in Hamilton Inlet - Labrador.

I send a specimen, also a
specimen of what I suppose
to be a Coral resembling
some forms of *Chonetes* in
Huronian Rocks, which I
found in June last near Little
Catalina - Newfoundland.

Some of the weathered surfaces
of the supposed Coral seem to show
the structure of *Chonetes*, and

allied species.

I send the specimens by
Book Post.

I should be glad to hear your
opinion on the supposed
Laurentian fossil as soon as
you can find it convenient to
give it attention. The "Note"
you would oblige me much,
if you think it worth while,
to read at an early meeting
of your Nat. Hist. Soc.

I have prepared a paper
and sent it to the Newfoundland
Government on the Relation
"of Anchor Ice to the Fisheries"
I find the effect of Anchor Ice
very great indeed in various
spots on the Labrador, and
as my paper already sent
will be printed I intend to
supplement it with a few

Observations of the great influence exercised
in various ways by 'Anchor Ice' in the
Sea. in the Straits.
