

Weymouth Riversdale 3 March 1877

Dear Sirs

I have been over all or most of Sr Danson's property north of the new Lion Road. The lines are very old and difficult to trace. Running the north end of the lot I could not find the line after it crossed the River. The lot is well wooded with small spruce on the north side so far as the river. After you cross the river it has been badly culled. I was at the Lake yesterday the best wood we saw was in the vicinity of the Lake. I thought of tracing the lines south of the Lion Road today, but the day is too wet to travel in the woods. There have been some parties trespassing on the

East side ~~side~~ of the property they have taken a few trees off and we saw one piece of timber made on the property (W. Wood). The adjoining property is Crown Land and it is reported the parties logging off it have liberty from Mr. Faulkner to do so, providing they take the logs to the new mill in Iron. Mr. King is waiting & very anxious for a reply to his offer for the property.
