Dear Dr Dawson

I am much obliged  
by your letter giving me  
an account of your conference  
with Judge Dunkin and  
arrangements for a reconsideration  
of the theological degree question  
- It seems to me that no  
really reasonable ground can  
be taken for the refusal to  
change the vote on the subject

I have had a letter from  
Sir Frs Hincks enclosing his  
letter printed in the Witness  
some time since and am  
glad to find that he takes  
a lively interest in the matter  
- My intention was, not to  
return to Montreal until  
about the 8<sup>th</sup> or 10<sup>th</sup> May  
which will be too late for  
my meeting concerning the  
sexual question - I suppose it  
would not do to postpone even  
to the regular meeting 25<sup>th</sup> April  
<sup>which is</sup>  
the earliest day that I can  
undertake

undertake to be in Montreal  
and earlier than I like  
- It is satisfactory to have  
got rid of the awkward decision  
of the B<sup>d</sup> of works about our  
Medicos -
