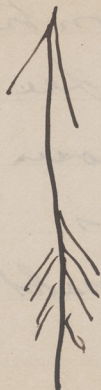

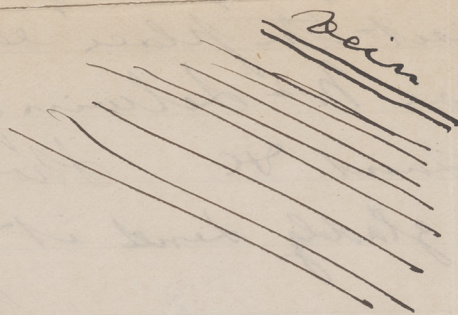

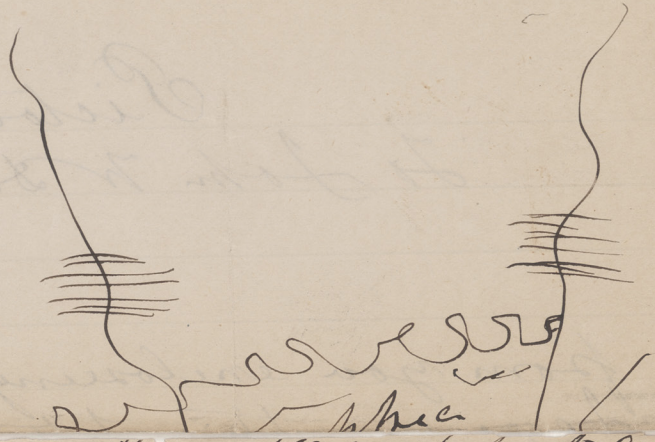

I noticed that the rocks seen on the north side of the Lake (Polson) and brook (on the rising ground) have a general uniformity of strike colour and appearance as the rocks on the south side of the same place but the space between those rocks on side of the brook is altogether changed showing strong indications of metamorphic action <sup>rocks</sup> of a somewhat grey colour inclining to green - Just like the rocks that overlies the vein. My opinion is the track of the vein is to be found in connection with the changed rocks, rather than in the strike of the general rock see sketch I go down to Polson Lake for to prepare for some gentlemen who are to visit the place early in May - the names some of them are Mr Selwin of Montreal - Mr McKay of Newfoundland &c Should I see any thing new I will gladly send it to you
