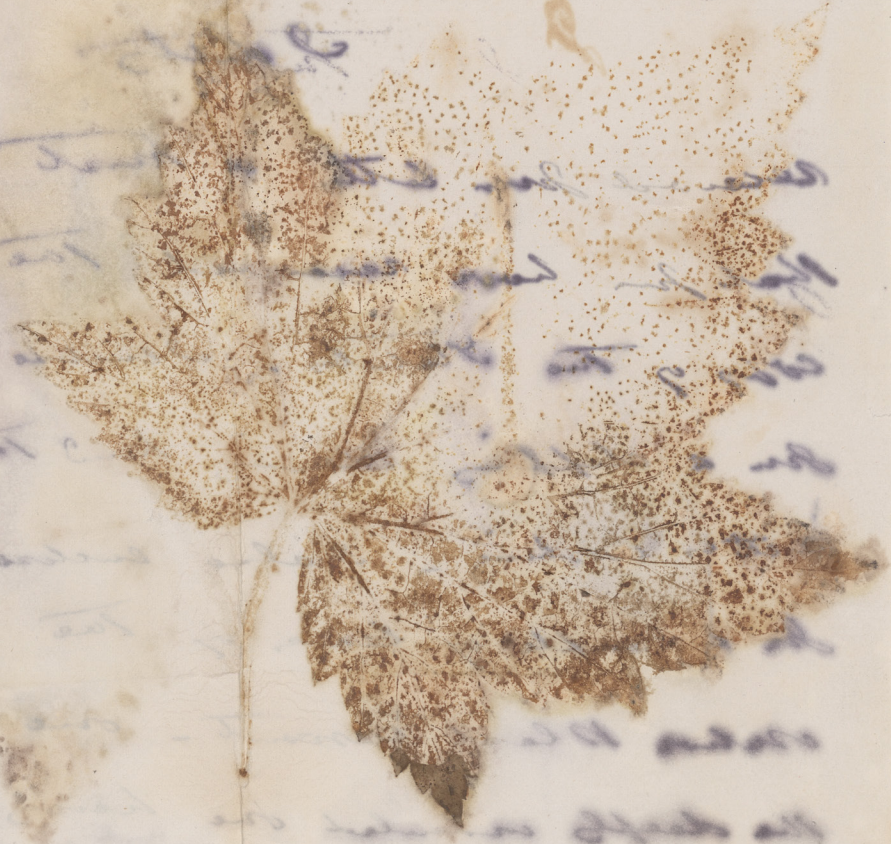

## St. John's College.

At a meeting of the Council of St. John's College on Tuesday, June 19th, the following gentlemen were elected as a Faculty of Theology in accordance with the resolution of Synod sanctioning the formation, under 40 Vict., cap. 11, sec. 31, of a Faculty of Theology for the granting of the theological degrees of B. D. and D. D.:—

The Most Rev. the Bishop of Rupert's Land, D.D., Professor of Ecclesiastical History; the Rev. Canon Grisdale, B.D., Professor of Systematic Theology; the Rev. Canon O'Meara, M.A., Professor of Exegetical Theology; the Ven. Archdeacon Cowley, B.D., Examiner in Homiletics and Pastoral Theology; the Rev. W. C. Pinkham, Examiner in Ecclesiastical History and Liturgiology; the Rev. R. Young, B.A., Examiner in Systematic Theology and Evidences; the Rev. O. Fortin, B.A., Examiner in Exegetical Theology and Greek; the Rev. S. P. Matheson, Examiner in Hebrew and Latin.

The faculty were empowered to draw up for the consideration of the Council regulations for proceedings in divinity and schedules of the subjects of examination.

The following gentlemen were elected Honorary Fellows under Statute I. of the Statutes of St. John's College. "The Council may elect as Honorary Fellows distinguished alumni of the college, benefactors of the college, or others deemed worthy of the distinction and connected in some prominent way with the church, country, or college."

The Right Rev. Bishop Anderson, D.D., formerly Head of the college; the Right Rev. the Bishop of Saskatchewan, D.D., formerly Warden; A. Thom, Esq., L.L.D., late Recorder of Rupert's Land—a benefactor; A. K. Isbister, Esq., L.L.D., Head master of Stationers' School, London, formerly a pupil of the school when under Mr. Macallum—a benefactor; the Ven. Archdeacon McDonald, formerly a pupil and scholar; R. T. Caldwell, Esq., M.A., fellow of Corpus Christi's College, Cambridge, formerly a pupil and scholar.

The following gentlemen were elected for a term limited to four years as representatives of St. John's College in the Senate of the University of Manitoba:—

The Ven. A. Cowley, B. D.; the Hon. J. Norquay, M.P. P., Minister of Public Works; the Rev. Professor Grisdale, B. D.; the Rev. Professor O'Meara, M.A.; the Rev. R. Young, B. A.; the Rev. O. Fortin, B. A.; the Rev. S. P. Matheson.

At the same meeting the Bursar reported that the fees and boarding charges, with the endowments, were just sufficient to meet current expenses of tuition, board, ordinary repairs, and insurance, but not to meet a sum of \$900 required to defray the interest on \$10,000 given to the chair of Ecclesiastical History, now temporarily invested in the buildings, and other obligations, and that if, as is hoped, funds may be obtained for the removal of these, that amount would still be required for increasing the efficiency of the institution. It was, therefore, resolved to increase the boarding charge by \$5 and the tuition by \$2.50 per term.

It was also resolved for the simplification of the accounts, which at present for the same term have to appear in two bills, to require that \$80 be lodged for each boarder with the Bursar as caution money, to remain in his hands till the boarder is withdrawn, and that in this case the bills be sent out at the close of the term, so as to include all items for the term instead of being sent out as at present at the close of the first month of the term. This regulation it was agreed should apply to all future admissions and as far as practicable to present boarders.
