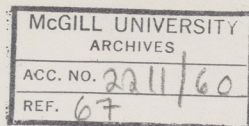

Allow me to thank you for the Supplement to the 2nd Edition of Canadian Geology a book which I had already regarded as the best prepared <sup>geological</sup> work upon any locality in America. I am more than ever pleased with it and especially with the ease with which you demolish the absurd glacial theories suggested by Agassiz and advocated and enlarged by Newberry & others.

I am in receipt of the box of fossils and pleased with them - The *Psilophyton* has to me the appearance of wood while the organism called *P gracillimum* by Lesquereux continues to appear to me like a graptolite. I would like to know the conclusion to which you have come respecting it.

In a few days I will have published "Contributions to Palaeontology by S. A. Miller & C. B. Dyer." It will contain about 18 species on two lithographic plates - I will mail it to you as soon as issued.
