I have pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of the fine specimens of the *Eozoon Canadense* which you were so good as to send us.

The donation was announced at a meeting of the Society on the second inst., and a vote of thanks tendered.

I should like to ask one question bearing on the origin of this structure; viz., Have genuine specimens of *Eozoon* ever been found ⁱⁿ ~~within~~ the immediate vicinity (5-10 feet) of a wall of some siliceous crystalline rock, such as granite, gneiss, mica schist, &c. ? That is, does it ever occur in the central portions of the great

limestone formations of the Laurentian.
We are non-committal concerning the
animosity of the Eozoon, - still wait-
ing for evidence.
