I have however taken care that each specimen shall contain at least one specimen of perfect Bessemer process. It is my hope that I must apologise for troubling you with so much description of specimens for so far as possible. As I have described them for England

I am of course unable to get any more specimens of this Limestone, while my excuse for not having sent them previously must be that I was trying to get some more presentable ones, especially of the corals.

I am much obliged for the copies of your papers which I lately received. I was present at the meeting in Halifax at which your paper was read; I think that on the whole it was received in a fair spirit, though some little bias in favor of Dr Honeyman may have been shown.

I have lately sent in an application for a position in the Laboratory of the Canada Geological Survey, which I hear is vacant, and shall be very thankful if you can find an opportunity to exert your influence on my behalf. I must also beg of you to hand over to Dr Girdwood some specimens of

Aragonite in Ankerite, which I
