a few days.

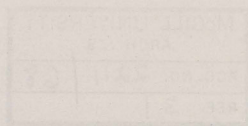
Since I wrote last
the Commercial crisis in
Montreal has diminished
rather than increased my
means of adding to our
Museum. Still I shall
be able to adhere to
the terms previously offered,

that is of Remembrance,
as I have cut the copy
of my letter here to
take the whole of
the collection of Desman
Plants for \$250 — one
half to be paid when
the specimens are for-
warded and the
remainder within ~~the~~
six months thereafter.
As to the packing I
am willing to pay
for this to the extent

of say \$10 and also to
pay the freight of rail
(with help, to Newark)

We would like the
boxes should be cubed
at the customs and worked
as containing specimens in
Natural history.

I am willing to hold
over this for ^{October} ~~November~~
30th but not later, and
if in the mean time
you can use this as a
means of obtaining a
check for much
