My dear Sir,

I am now in a position to inform you, having examined the Devonian Rocks <sup>on the shores</sup> opposite this place, that there are abundant plant remains & though generally fragmentary, yet I have already collected some specimens which I think could be determined. One of my specimens bears a close <sup>some</sup> resemblance to the fern figured in the Acadian Geology under the name

of *Cyclopteris Jacksoni*, of this  
I have some fragments showing  
the venation. I have also  
found remains of what I  
suppose to be *Lepidodendra*,  
& one of these appears to  
me to be comparable with  
*L. Gasparianum*. However  
this may be, I really  
think that it would be  
worth your while to see  
the rocks here. Tomorrow  
I leave for New Richmond  
where I shall remain  
till Monday next when  
I shall return here & I  
hope to have the pleasure  
of seeing you next week  
if you should think

proper to pay Dalhousie  
a visit. If you will kindly  
drop me a line to say  
when I may expect you  
I will engage a room  
for you at this hotel, or  
make such arrangements  
for your stay here as you  
may require. I have  
collected one or two food  
specimens of *Pterictis*  
& plenty of isolated plates  
of that genus, but I hope  
to be more successful  
with the rocks in the  
neighbourhood of New

Richmond. I will also  
look for plants there.
