My dear Dr Chauvean,

Some friends of
mine connected with
the Young Men's Christian
Association, have asked
me to write to you
on a subject which they

public interest, as
they have better fac-
ilities than any
other organization
for finding employment
for the men when
they are released,
and I know of

over the protestant firmings
that they may benefit
