Enclosed please find  
four Circulars - all of which have  
been of service - except the latest -  
in the country in leading people  
to help - and it (the latest) has  
been of great service in the  
City - I send you also  
a monthly Report in M.S. of  
work during last winter in  
such fields as urgently call  
for Mission effort - and aid -  
Among most interesting people  
only commencing out get two persons  
on their road that I don't \* list  
in the most remote settlements these  
Schools are well sustained - and  
attended by nearly all the parents  
as well as the children - there not  
\* from an eye witness now in town

having seen any other <sup>religion</sup>  
service there since my visit  
in one of these settlements - I held  
service in a house where  
lay the corpse of a youth  
who died in the hope of the  
Christian - He was 12 miles  
from any Protestant Minister  
and had not once been  
visited by one or prayed with  
but he had been a Sabbath  
School - School and the  
seed of the word had taken  
root - In another  
place a Minister spoke  
gratefully of the results of efforts  
wished - a continuance of them  
in his field - Saying - "How  
give you whole fortnights  
work - in the hands of  
my congregation!" -

If each is the need in one  
Congregation how much  
more so in fields where there  
is yet no Minister.  
The need of our newer  
settlements is really most  
urgent demanding the  
undivided services  
of even more than one  
Agent.
