On Saty. I went through  
the Ms. in order to locate the cuts.  
I find no reference to Man & his  
prox relation in Section Second. It is  
however referred to on p. 2 of Sect. Fourth.  
The American Mastodon named for  
Sect. Third is not mentioned therein.

Perhaps it was designed to come into the  
paragraph on the Cenzoic or Tertiary  
forming the word "In the middle part of  
the Tertiary most of leading groups were  
represented by more numerous species  
than at present, while many groups,  
then existing have now no representatives."

In Section Fourth there is no mention  
of the Cave of Fontal in Belgium. The  
reference is to the cave of Cro-Magnon.  
In this cut to be put in connection with

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that or will you add a line or two making reference to frontal? It could readily be inserted previous to your quotation from "Fossil Men". In that quotation a slight verbal change seems needed, though it may not be necessary, because it is a quotation. I refer to the passage "We have already noticed the remarkable skeleton of Cheulone".

The arrow heads & bone-weapons are not mentioned in the text but they probably are to be inserted as illustrative of what you say in the quotation of "the antiques seen in the American tribes among whom art and taste of various kinds — coexisted with barbarous modes of life &c.". Please inform if this is so.

When these points are settled it will be plain sailing & we shall push rapidly on.
