worth about \$100,000 at the time
of his marriage, we would have
liked to have been suppressed -
if true at the time, it certainly was
not later on, & there is a savour
of "bragging" in putting forward
that & also certain remarks of the
fess paid to Dr. Hulle & Mr. Hook
that we dislike -
