Can I trouble you to give me your opinion about two proposals for the location of a museum. The legislature has voted \$100,000 for enlargements. I send you a plan of building, and of proposed enlargement in dotted lines. Also an elevation of west end. The building is of four stories. The library is on the third over hall.

It has been proposed to devote the whole top floor to rooms for geological and Nat. Hist. Museum and lecture rooms. It would give an abundance of room. I have proposed in its place to devote the ^{west} end wing 43 x 60 feet, and fill up all windows and make a fire wall above roof. and divide the three vertical space of three stories into two, each 22 feet high, and make a gallery in each, and to leave the top floor the same as in old building. The first floor will gallery be devoted to Geol. & Min. The second to Geol. &c, and the top for Archaeology &c. I propose that the space of R. of old building be the lecture room of Geol & Min, and the same room on third floor to Nat History centrally distributed if present. The basement will give good work rooms.


