*Dear Sir*

*You are perhaps not aware that we have for sometime been trying to find out the proper gentleman to communicate with respecting the visit of the British Association to Montreal with the view of obtaining the appointment of the business Agents for carrying out all the arrangements for the Railway and Steamboat portion for the English members of the Association who purpose visiting Montreal.
