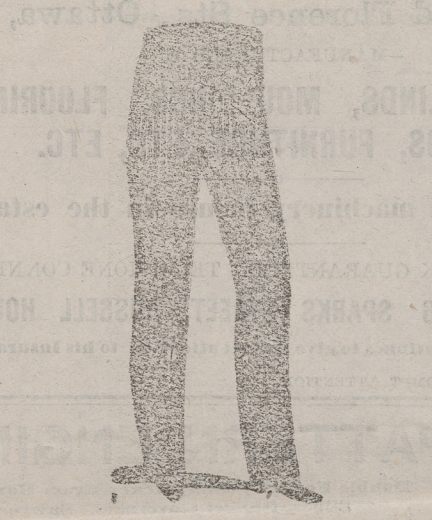

# WEATHER REPORT.

Meteorological Report.

Ottawa, 22nd, 9 p.m.—To-day witnessed a further improvement in the weather, which throughout the past twenty-four hours has been again bright and dry, and the temperature increased 12 degrees, the value rising from a slight minimum of 45 degrees, to a shade maximum of 74 degrees. At times the sky was more or less overcast with cirro stratus clouds, but the appearance has been mostly bright, and the air almost calm and sultry, with the wind east, southeast to east, northeast, backing to east. The decrease in pressure noticed yesterday evening was checked before 10 p.m.; and no material change has been shown since, the reading now equalling 30.17 inches.

# Toronto weather forecast.

Toronto, 23rd, 1 a.m.—A shallow depression covers the Upper Mississippi Valley, and the pressure is highest over the New England Coast. The weather has been fine and moderately warm from the lakes to the Atlantic, and fair, with stationary temperatures, in the North-West.

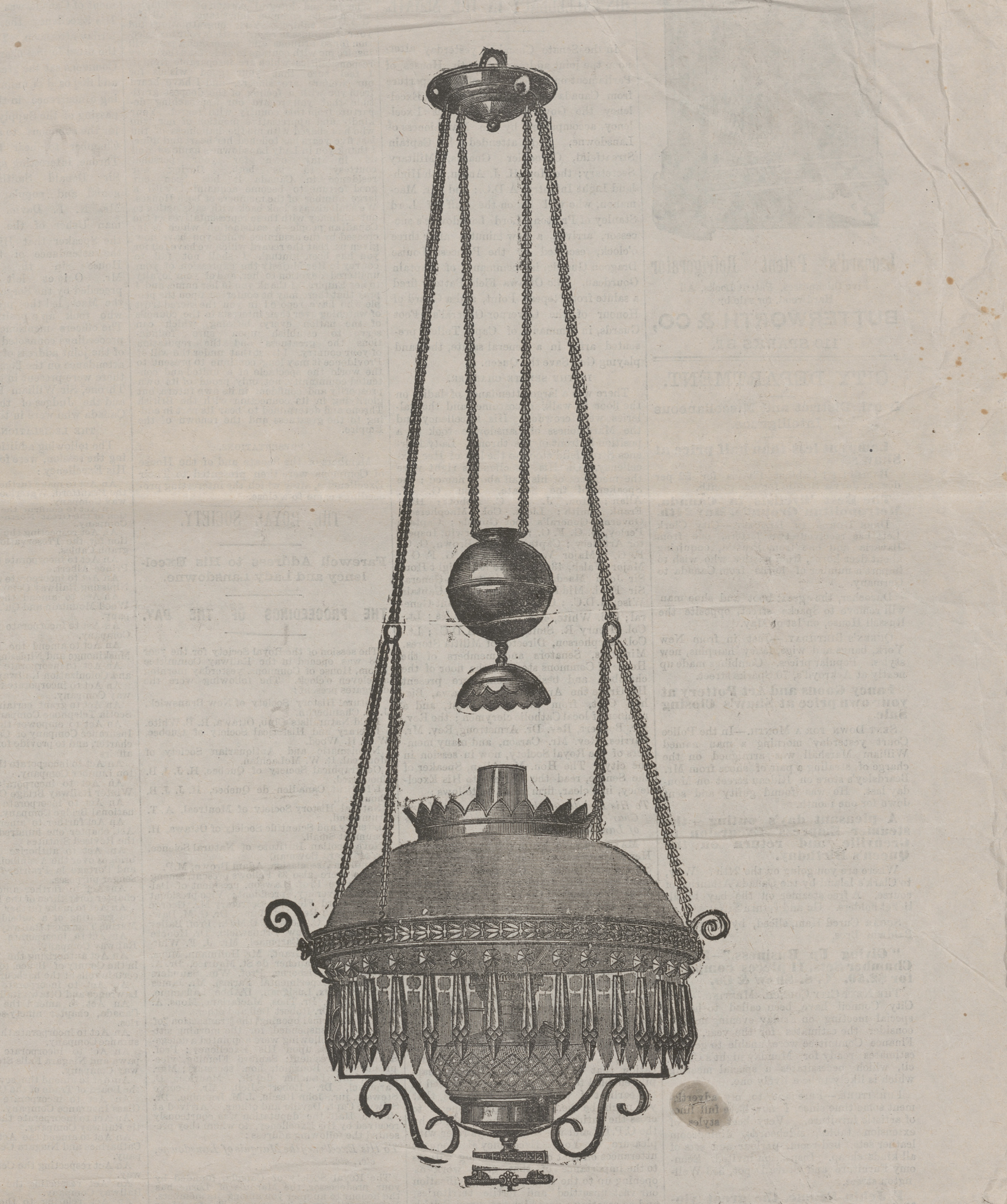
