Dear Dr. Hencke,

Since writing to you  
at Sherbrooke, I have received  
the reprint of School Law  
Clauses relating to the C. P. J.,  
which I forward herewith.

Please observe  
that the re-arrangement  
of the clauses practically  
wrecks the power of  
the Committee. More especially  
it leaves out and transfers  
our power of disposing of Superior Education Grants,  
& the Superintendent (under  
Annu. Stat. Cap. Xv. Sec 6 & New  
Annu. Stat. P 25). It also  
removes or leaves out all



power of direct inspection  
such as we have hitherto  
exercised, and involves  
considerably more power  
of a secretary. Attention  
is also required to the  
provision in section 4 as to  
"books having reference to religion  
or morals". This should  
be referred either here or  
in article 176 sec 2 of the  
new law. The provision  
as to school books in § 4  
P. 7 - article 44 relating to  
copyright is very objectionable

and cannot be carried  
out. In article 52, top of  
p. 9, the words "of the  
Department" should be  
inserted after "secretaries" of  
this paper is to be  
retained.

I regret that I cannot  
be at the meeting of Sub-  
Com.; but send the above  
contribution to aid in your  
deliberations.
