

ATHENÆUM.

*Extracts from the Rules and Regulations of the Club
relating to Honorary Membership.*

THE Clubhouse is open every day for the reception of Members, at Half-past Eight o'clock in the forenoon, during the Parliamentary Session, at Nine o'clock during the remainder of the year, and is shut up at One o'clock A.M., after which hour no Member can be admitted. Such Members, however, as may then happen to be actually within the house, are not to be restricted or influenced with respect to their departure by this Rule.

No Member shall give any money or gratuity to any of the Servants of the Establishment.

All Members are to pay their Bills for every expense they incur in the Club before they leave the house; the Steward having positive orders not to open accounts with any individual.

No persons are to be admitted into the Clubhouse but Members and Honorary Visitors individually invited by the Committee, or persons calling upon them, or upon business connected with the Club. No stranger to be admitted to view the house, unless accompanied by a Member, and between the hours of 12 and 3 P.M.

Servants are ordered not to serve Refreshments to any but Members and Honorary Visitors of the Club.
