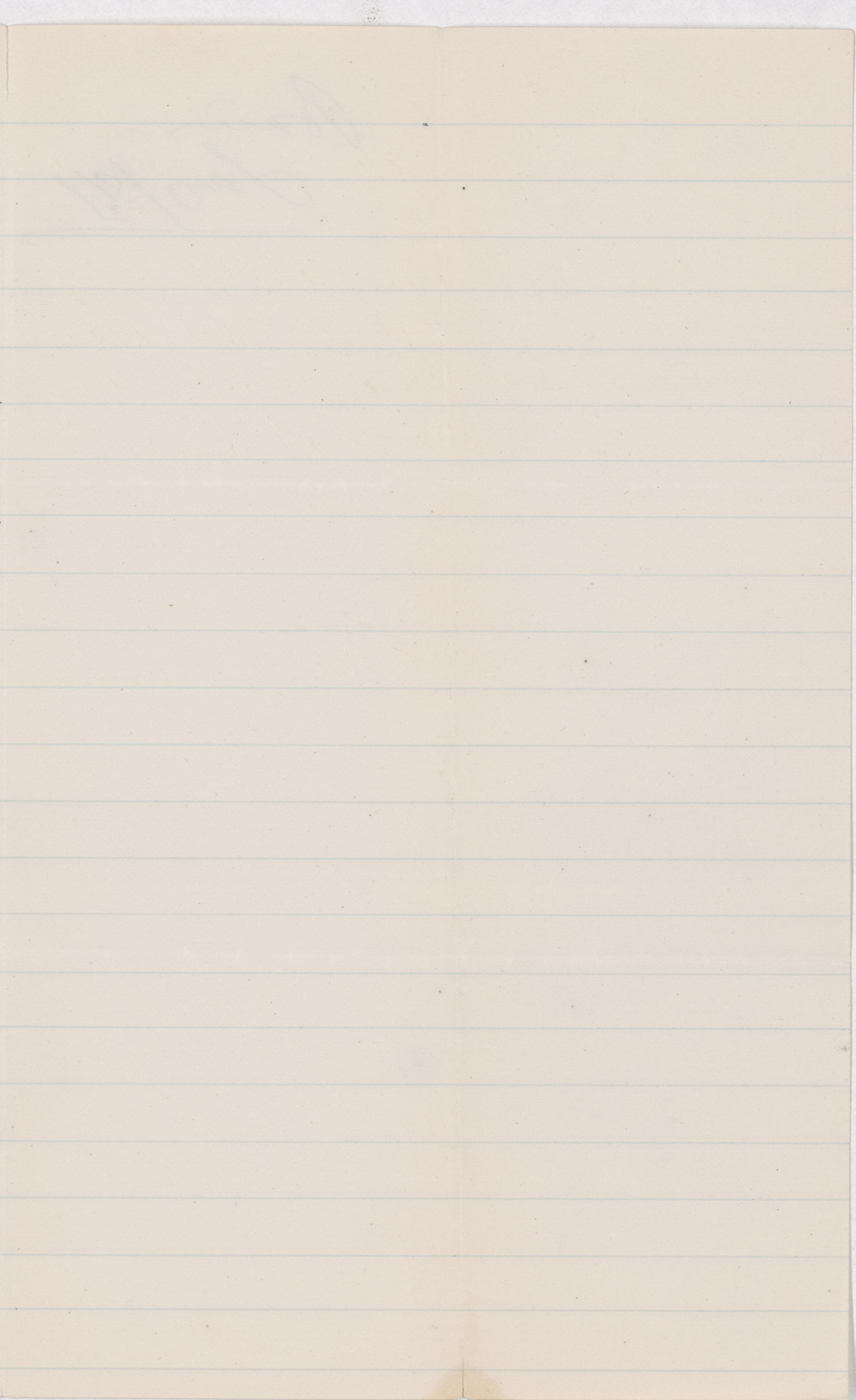
I may state that the Sec. showing stratigraphical connections is not drawn to scale, being only intended to show relation of deposits. The Sect. 9ft. high, however, is an accurate drawing, made on the spot, and exhibits correctly the
