I feel still very lonesome as regards man. Nothing earthly will ever fill the blank caused by my mother's departure. I do not feel that I have any ties now to the world. For some time before she passed away she was not able to help me much. Still I had her to cling to. I am staying with my aunt her sister - the last of the family. She is now in her 93^d year. I do not know how to feel at home as I did when my mother was with me.

The dressing gown which Lady Dawson gave my mother is in excellent preservation. I mean to keep it as long as I am on this side of the dark river. Poor body! many a time I have helped my mother to put it on and off.

Your kindness and Lady
Dawson's to us I shall ever re-
member

I question if I shall ever
visit Nitis again. Were it not
that I would like to see some old
friends once more I have no wish
ever to set foot in it again.

I was entitled to different treat-
ment from my brethren than
I received. What is the use of
Church rules if they be not respect-
ed? I would not for a pretty large
amount go again through the
worry connected with my removal.
The way I was treated gave my poor
mother a good deal of grief. Now
ever I am free ever.

Please give my very
kind regards to Lady Dawson.
