While the pages were in type it would have caused trouble and expense to place Fig. 14 of Chapter II on page 25, as there were so many cuts between that page and page 40, where the cut now is. But the pages have been electrotyped, and it is now impossible to change the place of the cut except by doing that part of the work over.

Our men are told to place all figures marked to face chapters near the beginning of the chapter. If you will please notice them on the slips, and mark on that proof all changes that are necessary, the cuts can be easily arranged in the order you prefer — the difficulty is to re-arrange <sup>them</sup> when they are in pages.
