I have just received
your postal of 25th

There is a quarry of Nepheline
Sienite, which has been largely
used by South Eastern R.R. It is
 $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles by road (north) & 15 minutes
ascent ^{on foot} of spur of the mountain.

One $\frac{1}{2}$ mile beyond this, & at
other places, rounded ridges
of limestone appears. The St. Dom-
inique lime kilns are upon the
continuation of this ridge.

Aqueous rocks extend up
Yamaska ^{to} a height of 600
or 700 feet.

Dear Sir

I have just received your postal of 22nd. There is a quarry of Nepheline syenite, which has been largely used at South Boston N. H. The 1 1/2 miles N. road (route) is 15 miles west of apex of the mountain. One mile past this point the faces, rounded ridges of granite appear. The St. Bon. ridge (Nepheline) are upon the continuation of the ridge. The green rocks extend up to a height of 600 or 700 feet.

There is a gravel pit on R.R.
just before you reach my farm
crossing. Sandy on top, boulders
below.

Should any number be going
to the quarry it would be well
to let me know in advance, &
yet it is not necessary, for I
could take 30 on a hay cart
with 4 horses.
