Dear Sir I forget to mention in my last
that in the case of any return specimens
you will favour me by receiving them
unpaid. I trust in your way however
they may wait for a time. You are
very welcome to retain any of these
you may wish for representative
purposes. The small Palace specimens
about 7 in length arranged on
the same flat with a large
number of specimens, - a very small
thing of equal form - I would

wish to keep if you do not specially
pursue it. I have a specimen (from
Anqueton) here, which appears to
very strongly corroborate Prof. Pilsbry's
view as to the spines, referred
to under oval bodies '5, thus:



The marginal ridges are strong, and
distinct, in spite of my account
to Park's species, more probably
the interior, another thus: *



with much finer striae, may possibly
be part of the interior.

* You have a duplicate but less exposed.

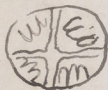
I hope to send these, and others

W. I have not succeeded in
procuring specimens of Bilalaria but
from the apparent arrangement of
sporangia thus:



Pointing inward and not outward
as in muricella. I cannot really
be more than the idea that Parke
in its justification at least, much
more ^{clearly} resembles the latter than the
former.
