Dear Sir William,

I take the liberty of introducing to you my friend Dr. Grenfell of the Mission to Deep Sea Fishermen. During the past two years this Mission has extended its operations to our fishermen on Labrador among whom it is doing a noble ^{work}. Two hospitals have ^{been} erected there during the past summer - three doctors and two trained nurses were engaged in attending to the sick and over 2,000

patients were treated.
The spiritual wants
of the people are not
overlooked. Wherever
the Mission ship
Albert goes religious
services are conducted
on board or on shore
when opportunity
offers - and a large
quantity of religious
literature is distrib-
uted. Clothing also
is given to the most
necessitous.

D. Geanfell who
is in charge of this
Mission goes to
Canada with the
view of enlisting
the sympathies of
your people in the
work so that

Next year he may
be able to extend the
operations of the
mission to Canadian
Labrador, and
erect an hospital
for the relief of
your fishermen
who frequent the
Gulf Coast -
